I like the fact that it takes a rush out of dating and finding one just highlighting: 1. truth and the power of togetherness2. and what we should be and do before we even start thinking about dating This book takes you on a journey from solo to dol to earn friends to decide if someone is right for you, dating for success, and eventually becoming engaged. I am a step-by-step type person, so I appreciated how carefully he was at the explanation to do and didn't make each stage. I also liked the fact that he doesn't just immerse himself in the spiritual aspect of relationships, but gives some practical advice on: how to meet people and make friends (for all my fellow introverts!) -debunking myths about finding one (Is there really only one person for us?) - knowing what qualities should you and shouldn't use to decide whether you should date someone (definition of Wifey and husband stuff)-how to decide if someone is the right partner for you (How will I know if they are one?) - reasons that we often use to rationalize time with the wrong person (He's just afraid... Yes right!) -How to avoid problems in 5 areas that are the cause of most family issues (safe protection of your future marriage!) I mean, it really breaks it! What I didn't like about this book. The content from chapter to chapter is a bit repeated. But knowing Dr. Munro's premeditation, I bet it wasn't an accident. Though I was initially annoyed by him, I had to admit that the points he repeated were the ones I or completely eliminated in the past. PREPARING TO DATE The word dating comes from the idea of setting a date where two people agree to come together at a certain time and place to relax and socialize. Although dating as we know that today is not a biblical concept, it has nevertheless become carefully embedded as a social norm. Here we discuss courtship (which is broken into two stages: dating and engagement. But

what, exactly? What is its purpose? When is the man READY to date? What guidelines are appropriate for a good relationship? These are important questions that deserve solid answers! Understanding this is important for both adolescents and parents. One common question teens (and parents) ask: How old should a person be before starting a relationship? The answer is not as simple as some are trying to do it. There is more involvement than just assigning a chronological age. In fact, the answer depends on ... The attitude of parents and the level of development of the child. Thus, a person's willingness to start a relationship is largely a matter of MATURITY and ENVIRONMENT. Four principles of date readiness 1. You should have gained enough knowledge about the benefits and dangers of dating/courtship: There is nothing in life that can make so many short changes to a person's fate, make the wrong decision about a partner's life. The principle of application here ... You don't DURING courtship, you prepare yourself for courtship! Courtship should never catch you by surprise. The key to a successful marriage is not love; it's not even choosing the right partner (although it's very important). The key to a super marriage relationship is KNOWLEDGE - proper knowledge and proper application of knowledge. It has been said that if any topic is you and you really want to become successful in it, you should have to read books equal to your age. At least you had to read 15 books on how to build a marriage relationship, listened to a few posts, learn from MENTOR (S) etc. and if you realize how much training is required at this level, you'll learn that these 15 books aren't even enough at all! In the final analysis, we say that Healthy relationships should always begin at spiritual and intellectual levels - levels of purpose, motivation, interests, dreams, and personality. So, ask yourself, Do I fully understand the benefits and dangers of dating? Write down the answers to these questions and then take action on them! Until you are able to answer these questions to a certain satisfactory level, you do not read to start a marital relationship2. You must have understood God's own guidelines and STANDARDS for courtship: This requires a certain degree of SPIRITUAL MATURITY. If you are consciously not seeking to understand God's guidelines and standards for marital relations, you are bound to follow the default path of the world. This means that there are only two options: either you consciously choose to follow God's instructions and standards, or you will be doomed to follow the default path of the world. It is utterly unreasonable to ignore God's standards and still expect a pious result. Some of God's guidelines and standards include: i. Relationships should be presented to God's Mentoring: By themselves you are not protected, with your partner you may face the worst. But the three-time cord is not easily broken (King Solomon, Ecclesiastes 4:12). ii. Both parties must be committed to LIFE-LONG LEARNING- Every house built by wise planning, it becomes established through common sense, and profits are wonderful, KEEPING ABREAST FACTS! (King Solomon, Proverbs 24:3-4) iii. Before you start, you should have a marriage in sight-Care is no place for trial and error. The true definition of courtship is to build a life together between two people (of the opposite sex) with marriage in sight. You have to start with the end in mind! ... Mary was supported (declared married) to Joseph (Matthew 1:18) iv. And many others. So ask yourself, Am I spiritually and emotionally mature enough to enter this path? write down the answers to these questions and then take action on them! If you can't answer these questions well, you're not ready. You must be RESOLVED in your spirit that you will not be below or compromise God's standards: Whenever you are below God's standards, you prove that you are not mature spiritually or emotionally. A solid influence on what you believe is a sign of spiritual and emotional maturity. Ask yourself, Have I decided in my heart to follow God's standards without any compromise? You are ready for a date when you don't need to: You need to imply that there is something missing in your life. The opposite of necessity is CHOICE, which allows you to make a decision. This means that you have to develop yourself to the point that you feel complete (and not incomplete need to be completed). If you enter into a relationship looking for that to get out (from the other person) and the other person is also looking for that to get (out of you), by the time you're both done, you'll be left with zero leftovers! You have to come wise to give and add value. When you view marital relations as a CHOICE issue, not AN NECESSITY, then you are ready. You have to get to the point where you are comfortable being lonely. At this point, the relationship is becoming ADDED BLESSING! Learn to be AN ASSET first! You must be busy preparing yourself for who God has prepared for you. Most people are so busy finding someone God has prepared for them that they cannot prepare for this man; I reproach such people in the name of Jesus! If you don't prepare yourself and add value to yourself, so you can be an asset to another person, two things will happen... i.) You'll end up in the hands of someone like you who's also unprepared.ii.) You like a potential bomb that is just waiting to be blown up and cause problems for the relationship. Don't let this happen to you. Few thoughts (other principles): A truly lonely person is a person who is complete physically, emotionally, spiritually, and intellectually, without being dependent on anyone else. Truly one person has (i.) a healthy self-recote (ii.) clear and firm faith (iii.) roots in God.Seek God's Kingdom first, the best place to find a pious man is on the way to the Kingdom of God. In addition to the stated readiness test, we can say, If you want someone who will ultimately be a friend, not a lover, and that you will be a friend, not a lover, then you are ready to start a marital relationship. FRIENDSHIP BUILDING - The purpose of Dating Building Friendship is the greatest value and, in fact, the primary purpose of the courtship period. Building Friendship: FOCUS on getting another person to talk about themselves, not themselves: A way it: Ask questions both on the other person's interests. Be selfless! Ask questions about the four main categories of human life - family, education, interests, and spiritual things. SHARE's sadness and joy with them: Be prepared, ready and available to give your friends comfort and support during trials and times of joy. Remember: Total grief halved while the total joy of DOUBLED! ASSUME PERSONAL RESPONSIBILITY for our friend's reputation: ALWAYS SEEK FOR YOUR friends-always! SHARE FREE as you grow in inner strength, become better and learn new things! Let the improvement in your life create an appropriate improvement in the lives of your friends. In other words, become better for your friends. SHARE SCRIPTURAL PRINCIPLES and VALUES are free with friends. Be faithful, faithful and accessible. Final Thoughts (Other Principles): Friendship is not a gift, but it is RESULT conscious hard work! The best way to make a friend is being a friend. Intimate friends are friends who are close enough and who have enough freedom to fix each other. Close friends share the same vision and life goals and go in the same direction3. MYTH MATE-FINDINGFACT #1: KNOWLEDGE IS THE BASIS. The main cause of problems in marital relations is the lack of KNOWLEDGE (or inaccurate knowledge) before the beginning. Your level of correct information determines the level of your relationship. However, TWO BEST SOURCE of information and wisdom: From God himself andwise advice from trusted mentors! Fact #2: No one can ever experience a successful marriage without a SOLID PLAN- Plans of the Righteous will surely lead to abundance (King Solomon, Proverbs 21:5). Thus, we have established two key principles that are necessary for success in a marriage relationship: i.) Solid plan (ii.) KNOW (or God's Wisdom) to carry out these plans. But even cautious, well-established plans will fail if they are based on faulty information. That's why it's important to have accurate information before we start. It is much easier (and much better) to avoid errors at the beginning than to try to fix them in the middle of the thread. Now it's time for some myth-smashing! Myths are ideas usually considered true, but was based only on faulty information (or false concepts). Myths that need to be corrected:1. God has only one special person for me: There are no biblical reasons for this idea. There are pious options, so the Bible provides options for remarriage. The defeat of this myth leads to two important conclusions: first, if there are many pious options, then marriage is one of those options becomes the CHOICE that we do. Secondly, the choices we make to marry a particular person require a firm commitment on our part to be FAITHFUL to those we choose. In a nutshell CHOICE and COMMITMENT go hand in hand!2. God chooses the man he wants me to marry: It's also not true. I heard someone say sort of: When I prayed, I had a vision of where The Lord told me I was going to marry John. Wherever this vision comes from, it did not come from the Lord, and that is why. If God told this woman in the vision that she should marry John, then God has violated both her will and John's. Having told her that she must marry John, God even violated her will to choose John, as well as John's will to refuse. But we understand that God created us all with the freedom of choice and never violates that freedom. Moreover, if God chooses for you, you will make God responsible for the success or failure of that relationship. Few thoughts (other principles): God can bring a potential partner through your path, but he does not choose this person for you. You make this choice yourself based on what you have learned about this person and the nature of friendship that develops. The key to finding the right partner is to first identify the qualities and character that we will keep as our standards without compromise and then evaluate the potential candidates we meet in accordance with these standards. Choosing a life partner is not a matter of receiving magical meaning or supernatural revelation, which is. This is one thing! This is exactly what makes finding a life partner CHOICE in the true sense of the word. Of all the people we know, of all the friendships we develop, from all the legitimate possibilities before us, we CHOOSE one person with whom we want to spend the rest of our lives. This choice is not a flying, casual, head-in-the-cloud choice, but a DELIBERATE, SOBER, FEET-FIRMLY-PLANTED-ON-THE-GROUND DECISION. It reaches the place where you walk up to someone else and say with deliberate confidence, I choose you. 4. DISSERING LIFE PARTNERThings for validation:1. Is he a Christian? The principle is that anyone we consider to be married should display THE WORLD OF THE GROWTH, and so should we. You must clearly see Christ's life in Him. What words does he use? How will he develop and cope with spiritual things? What is his level of commitment in the local assembly? The believer and the unbeliever have no basis for spiritual intimacy. Anyone we consider for marriage should display CONTINUING EVIDENCE of spiritual growth, and so we need 2. What is my purpose of life? Dating and marriage are directly related to God's purpose in (and for) our lives. Find out what your life goals are and then learn also what the other person's life goals are and see if they are compatible. It becomes easy for you to know what kind of woman should come into your life when you have clarity about where you are going in life. For example, if my vision towards a nation (or changing the world) is a woman, should come into you life should be able to great, be committed to living long learning, always have to be willing to change, grow, improve and handle giant things. Couples who have no similar goals will not prepare for each other3. Does he have self-control? You must be emotionally intelligent. The most important area where a person should exercise self-control is in the area of sex. The principle is that Anyone who exercises self-control in the field of sex will also practice self-control in other, less complex areas. 4. Is there harmony in his house? Anyone we consider to marry should have a generally good relationship with their own family. That's because Unresolved Conflict Translations! 5. Is this the right time? The question is whether you are both willing to commit to this new life (with more cooperation, less freedom and unconditional loyalty). There are three issues that we need to address to help determine the right time: (I.) Parental Consent (II.) Financial Readiness (III.) Educational Goals. The purpose of seeking parental consent is to ensure that no parent becomes an enemy of marriage (or offender who has taken their child from them). What is my gift (or how can I contribute) to this person? Ultimately your marital relationship is just the RESULT of what you put on a regular basis. Marriage is a reward, not a gift. Marriage is the result of work that both parties have put in. The Bible says: Two are better than one because they will have a REWARD of their LABOUR (or investment) (Ecclesiastes 4:9)There are three stages that are involved in building a marital relationship:1. Dating is a time when couples from time to time meet and mostly talk about their spiritual communication. Here you set if you are both at the same spiritual frequency. Next is the soul level where you start checking to see if you can relate and reach yourself intellectually.2 Engagement is the level of dreams and planning. You both participate in sitting to discuss your financial plans together, and start creating a mental picture of the kind of home, family and life you aspire to build together. Your goals are recorded and they are high enough to stretch you both. You write goals on paper and you both have copies with you, so you can work individually, but in the same direction. In the nutshell, participation should be a serious but joyful time PLANNING and ANTICIPATION.3. Marriage- Here you enter a full commitment and you can consume the relationship through physical union. Here the couples begin to implement and fulfill all the plans that they made during the engagement!5. ENGAGEMENT: Preparing for marriageEngagement is different from dating (period of departure and confirmation of your beliefs and alignment values and comparability). In the engagement, you're already planning to get married. It's like he or she was already your spouse. The dating period is a confirmation period. But the period of engagement is when a marriage covenant is established between a man and a woman. It is time for deepening friendships and spiritual one that they had to develop during the period of acquaintance. Participation is a hardcore PLANNING engagement is a syal planning in which a couple gets up to brass tacks to life after a wedding. Marriage is too important an issue, too sacred an institution to enter into easily or lightly or without adequate preparation. The couple must understand and AGREE that they are both responsible for everything that goes into making their marriage work. Participation is not a time of idleness and pie-in-the-sky-by-and-by-dreaming, but a period of HARDWORK and PREPARATION. Marriage is even, but marriage is life.6 ENGAGEMENT: Atonement TimeFor some people attending means going out to rice and chicken, ice cream, going to the movies, holding hands, kissing, and such. It's not an engagement, it's a date. Of course, engaged couples do this kind of thing because they have to keep dating, but participation involves a lot more. Interaction literally means interacting with, being in gear with. With participation, the goals of the couple, goals, dreams, desires and values must be interconnected with each other, and they should be in gear with each other as they move forward with their practical training to bring these things through. The participation of HARD-CORE PLANNING, where the couple gets up to brass tacks preparing for life after the wedding. Spiritual Foundation: It's not about whether every partner is a believer. This should be installed while your partner is recognized. During the engagement, the couple must lay a solid spiritual foundation. No area is more important for future family success than for couples to make sure they are in the transmission spiritually that they see face-to-face on spiritual issues! For example:1. Recognizing God's role as a Spiritual Leader (not a dictator!) at home under the common Lord of Jesus Christ. A person should be willing to accept this RESPONSIBILITY. Therefore, a woman must learn to understand her role as a woman and to respond accordingly.2 The agreement of the same church to be attended is essential for spiritual harmony. One thing is the glue that keeps the relationship together. Few thoughts (other principles)1. (Finances) Couples should work together and be equally aware of the financial condition of the household, as they are married partners, not just two people living in the same house2. I don't have to commit to life-LONG LEARNING! Marriage will be better only if each partner develops better3. Participation is the time to set goals and plans; marriage is the time to Plan.4. (Education) Parenting is CAPITAL RESPONSIBILITY. There needs to be a solid financial plan in place to have a COMFORTABLY take care of the baby before considering having a baby. The reason is that children deserve to be born into a family environment, emotionally, spiritually and financially stable. 5. Participation is a time when all SEEDS for future family success are planted. Successfully coping with sexual temptation, the couple proves their maturity, honesty, loyalty and self-control. Such a pair will MODEL for many others. My thoughts: I believe so strongly that every Christian home should be a MODEL for all other marriages on earth. I decided to make my home a model because I choose to stand by God's standards and guidelines. I will have to make the same commitment today. I recommend the following life-changing, family modeling movies: Courageous, Fiery, Flywheel Brothers Kendrick, etc. I hope the message was clear, simple and very practical.
